Message from the Imperial Bilo

Over the past two weeks we have chased up the long overdue repairs to the 5 Kindergartens, Avelina arranged with the builder to take us to each site and go over all maintenance items and equipment replacements. Theses project should be finished within 2-weeks with one kindergarten being completed already.

The Sigatoka Sand Dunes National Park fence was also signed off by all concerned after alternate designs were required due to supply issues with intended materials, the builder even had blocks and materials delivered on site a few days ago and took at least 6-weeks to have everything completed.

We met with the local bank branch accountant to chase up missing term deposit receipts and bank statements, all in order now. We also met with the hotel's accountant to go over reports, adjustments, missing reports and information needed.

We identified the urgent need for at least 3 AED's and 4 stretchers, this will be funded by us after signoff by hotel management and should be in place for October. An AED will be placed near the golf shop, one near the water sports bure and one in a central location near the shops.

We welcomed Avelina back as the Bilo Bar coordinator, Avelina saved us many hours thanks to her local knowledge on matters with the kindergartens and the banks.

Surprisingly, the Registrar of Companies office requires further paperwork for our registration, and we spent one afternoon just on this. Their administrative requirements are hard to follow when there are no written regulations, and they take two months just to process a form.

Many meetings were held with heads of various hotel departments, the issue of local papers for members was raised.

The various room rates given to members were also looked into and in the end, we were given a set of rates for the reunion period/s this year, but these need to be booked direct via reservations and requesting re-union rates, Andrew should have this up on the web and Facebook sites before you read this. The discount code previously given for the online bookings is a discounted rate, but it will vary due to demand.

We spent our last day inspecting the one finished kindergarten project and then sourcing stationery & school materials for all the kindergartens and delivering them, Andrew will place a list of items in the newsletter, all items need to go to Avelina who can distribute them in line with attendee numbers to each kindergarten.

Looking forward to seeing you all at the Oct/Nov reunion, our condolences to those that have left us.

Sigatoka Sand Dunes





The Sigatoka Sand Dunes is one of our pre-historic sites. Evidence of the past is clearly visible throughout the dune's system as pottery scatters, stone tools, human remains, and other archaeological relics continue to be uncovered by natural processes. However, the deteriorating state of the fencing at the Sigatoka Sand Dunes National Park was brought to the trustees' attention late last year. The trustees, after inspecting the area, saw the need to have it replaced to prevent animals, unauthorized visitors and drunkards from accessing the site.


Kindergarten

There were some renovations work done by the building contractor. Works include changes of window frames and shutters for the whole building. The club assisted in replacing all missing louver blades. The wooden posts that were falling off were all replaced as well. We spoke to the school committee with regards to the safe keeping of the building and as well the compound. A total of 14 children attend this Kindy.

Priorities for the students include stationaries like paints, glue, A4 paper, crayon, colored pencils, pen and plasticine to name a few.



Ron Jones Kindergarten

This was one of the well-kept kindergartens. We have replaced the toilet breather, gutter fitting, window screen and louvres for the Kindergarten. The outdoor light as well was replaced. Upon visiting the school, we also noted that the fence needed repair and as well as the see-saw. A request has been made to the contractor to fix the fence and replace the damaged see-saw. The new teacher is Ms. Payal Rao who travels from Sigatoka Town on a daily basis to attend her classes. The school has a class roll of 10 students. Paints, glue, A4 paper, crayon, colored pencils, pen and plasticines is what they need at the movement.









Naevuevu Kindergarten

Located at the center of Naevuevu Village is the Kindergarten with a total of 13 students enrolled in it. Upon visiting the Kindergarten, we saw a need for a thorough clean-up around around the compound. Our building contractor has agreed to work on the falling fence. The new teacher, Ms. Jokapeci Daulako is very friendly. She looks after her students well and understands the need to maintain the school.



Yadua Kindergarten

Guess what, we have managed to fix the roof that was leaking so bad and repaired the fence at Yadua Kindergarten. Thanks to all our members, because of your tireless efforts and support we thought we give this priority as it needed urgent attention before school resumed this year.

The classroom is now a safe learning environment for the students who are enjoying their day-to-day classes. We also met Ms. Aviame Vibose and according to her a total of 18 students are enrolled for this year. They have requested us to assist them with their crayons, colouring pencils, paints, A4 paper, glue, plasticine and some sporting equipment.

Sigatoka Kindergarten

This is the kindergarten with the highest class roll, running two streams of classes on a daily basis. Each classroom has about 15 students. The school is well maintained so there wasn't much work needed. However, upon visiting them, we noticed that there was a drainage problem which needed to be addressed. During heavy downpour and because of the locality of the school, flood waters can easily enter the classroom. The gutters also need attention. The contractor that was with us on the day will be providing a quote for the work that needs to be carried out. The school is lucky to have retained Ms. Ana who looks after the building and the facility well. A new teacher is currently looking after the second stream. They have opted for more stationaries to assist the students.


